of the four main dimensions of IWRM (2017 baseline)











Strengthening national monitoring and reporting frameworks on SDG 6.5 on IWRM, identifying critical areas for attention that hinder progress on IWRM at the national level.

Share of stakeholders who took part in 2020 consultations around SDG 6.5.1


In 2020, over **2400 participants** took part in formal consultations on the status of IWRM in **61 countries**, coming from the following stakeholder groups.


How well did the consultations meet the stakeholders' objectives?

Improve IWRM implementation in the Pra and Tano basins.



Support the reform of the state water programme by setting up a scientific-technical council.



Increase public awareness of IWRM by developing and implementing a communication strategy.



Contribute to the institutionalization of the Water Law.



Localisation of SDG-6 targets and development of an implementation strategy and monitoring.



Developing capacity and sharing international experiences.
