According to the UNFCCC, Least Developed Countries (LDCs) are among the most vulnerable to the adverse effects of climate change. In particular, widespread poverty limits their adaptive capacity<sup>1</sup>. While climate change impacts will be manifested through the water cycle, many LDCs lack adequate water infrastructure, inadequate information systems for better water management, and their institutional capacities to manage the scale of predicted impacts are inadequate. Investments in water infrastructure and better climate information as well as development of capacity of institutions to build resilience are required. Various initiatives have been started to strengthen water management and adapt to climate change.

The UNFCCC has supported a number of countries to develop National Adaptation Programmes of Action (NAPAs). In addition, many countries have developed Integrated Water Resources Management Plans as a response to the 2002 World Summit on Sustainable Development (WSSD). Building synergies between IWRM plans and NAPAs is essential to maximize opportunities for coherent cross-sectoral adaptation and to integrate water security and climate change in national development plans.

This panel debate will draw on the knowledge of experts involved in development of IWRM plans and NAPAs to identify win-win opportunities for strengthening synergy during development and implementation of these plans.
