

Global Water Partnership-Caribbean Supports National Stakeholder Consultations in Jamaica for the Draft National Water Sector Policy and Implementation Plan

The Global Water Partnership-Caribbean (GWP-C) in partnership with the Caribbean Community Climate Change Centre (CCCCC) is implementing a Water Climate and Development Programme (WACDEP) for the Caribbean.

WACDEP aims to support the adaptation of Caribbean countries to climate variability and change through the implementation of better water policies, strategies, programmes and water-related adaptation actions defined in the Caribbean Community (CARICOM) Implementation Plan for Achieving Development Resilient to Climate Change.

Jamaica is one of the WACDEP focal countries in 2014 and the GWP-C is therefore providing support for activities carried out by national agencies and organisations which foster climate resilience in the Jamaican water sector. This includes the development of appropriate legal frameworks, policies, strategies and sectoral plans.

GWP-C commends the efforts of the Ministry of Water, Land, Environment and Climate Change who produced the recently completed Draft National Water Sector Policy and Implementation Plan for Jamaica, which emphasises climate adaptation aspects.



We are therefore pleased to partner with the Ministry in the finalisation and adoption of the revised Water Policy, through our support of National Stakeholder Consultations throughout Jamaica in April, on the Draft Policy and Plan.

We also welcome the opportunity to work with our GWP-C network partners in Jamaica who are actively engaged in the policy document revision process. These organisations include: the Water Resources Authority, the National Water Commission, the National Irrigation Commission Limited, the Rural Agricultural Development Authority and the Rural Water Supply Limited.

IWRM is a holistic approach to managing water that takes into account that different uses of water are interdependent. The approach is grounded in the understanding that water resources is an integral component of the eco-system, a natural resource, and a social and economic good.

GWP-C has more than 80 partners from the following countries: Anguilla, Antigua, Aruba, The Bahamas, Barbados, British Virgin Islands, Cuba, The Commonwealth of Dominica, Dominican Republic, Grenada, Guyana, Haiti, Jamaica, Martinique, Montserrat, Puerto Rico, St. Kitts & Nevis, St. Lucia, St. Vincent & the Grenadines, Suriname, Trinidad & Tobago, The United States Virgin Islands, The United States of America and Canada.

- To promote IWRM as the approach to water resources management in the Caribbean region and to obtain national commitment towards IWRM implementation.
- To improve water governance in the Caribbean through the promotion, enhancement and effective implementation of legislation, polices and programmes on IWRM.
- To promote public participation in the management of water resources through capacity building and information sharing at the community, national and regional levels.
